South Vancouver Neighbourhood House (SVNH) is currently seeking an experienced **Preteen Community Programmer** to join the team and provide support to Preteen and Youth Programs at SVNH.

The Preteen Community Programmer is responsible for supervising, planning, organizing, and implementing a new program for the United Way School's Out SVNH Program: Preteen Mentorship. This program is for children 6-12 years-old who attend elementary schools in South Vancouver. The Programmer is responsible for coaching and mentoring high school students who attend nearby secondary schools, preparing them to be mentors for younger children. The Preteen Community Programmer brings energy and enthusiasm to the youth team in addition to a passion for working with children and youth.

Duties and Responsibilities:

- Lead program promotion, participant recruitment, and community outreach for 3 afterschool programs, and a summer program at SVNH, in partnership with the Community Schools Team
- Provide program supervision, develop and implement program curriculum, lead youth recruitment and training
- Develop and facilitate programming with a focus on literacy (including storytelling), child rights, arts/culture, and physical activity
- Maintain registration documents, income/expense records, attendance, program statistics, and monthly reporting
- Create a closer network of agencies in South Vancouver to support middle years programming while addressing children's health holistically and celebrating cultural diversity
- Encourage participants to take part in activities; provide feedback to participants and their caregivers
- Prepare nutritious snacks, keep supplies stocked, and keep shared program area clean
- Accompany participants on special field trips during Winter, Spring, Summer Breaks, and Pro-D Days
- Host child-directed events for National Child day (Nov.20) and World Refugee Day (June.20)
- Provide information, referral, and accompaniment services for children, youth, and families to other programs at SVNH, or in the community
- Attend quarterly meetings with the Community Schools Team and program partners to share best practices and make improvements based on participants' needs

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's Degree in relevant discipline and combined with 2 years of working experience with children and youth
- Knowledge of children and youth services
- Previous experience with program planning and facilitation
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills in English, a second language an asset
- Good interpersonal, leadership, and program planning skills
- Proven expertise in multicultural setting; experience working with diverse populations
- Ability to recruit and supervise volunteers
- Strong organizational and time management skills
