Job overview

The South Vancouver Neighbourhood House (SVNH) is looking for two enthusiastic, empathetic, and community-minded individuals for the role of a Trauma Informed Clinical Counsellor for the months of June to December. The successful candidate will provide one-to-one therapy sessions for women who are in various stages of domestically violent relationships or youth ages 15-19 who are struggling with mental health and anxiety. During the project, the successful candidates will receive two clinical supervision sessions for clinical support.

Overview of responsibilities

Under Covid-19 safety guidelines, each Clinical Counsellor will:

- Provide one-to-one counselling sessions for a minimum of 5 clients, which can be a combination of women who are in various stages of domestically violent relationships or youth who are struggling with mental health, anxiety, and/or depression
- Attend two clinical supervision sessions
- Complete administrative tasks of tracking the number of hours worked per month
- Work closely with SVNH's Domestic Violence Support Worker and youth program staff to manage referral and case load

Qualifications and skills

- Be a registered clinical counsellor with the BC Association of Clinical Counsellors; be trauma informed as the successful candidate will be working with women with PTSD
- Minimum two years' experience in working with vulnerable, at-risk women and/or youth ages 15-19
- Minimum two years' experience in at least one of the following: Trauma Based Cognitive Behavioural Therapy, Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing Therapy (EMDR), Sensorimotor Psychotherapy or Narrative Therapy
- Awareness and understanding of domestically violent relationship cycles, habits, and trends
- Awareness of trends, needs, and barriers of newcomers and/or racialized women and/or youth from low-income families
- Current criminal record check clearance
- Ability to work collaboratively in a team and independently
- Strong communication skills (verbal, written, email) and organization skills
