#### **DECOLINIZING IN SOUTH VANCOUVER**

Our walk toward decolonization continues. It is a path that we have chosen, and we hope that our footprints leave impressions of change on the community.

Together, as a house, we have produced multiple events to honour the Indigenous people. In the last year, we have had over 20 events where we have gathered, celebrated, and taught others as a community with our Indigenous partners, council, and leaders. These events included Indigenous learning circles, storytelling for children, the South Side Hub grand opening and more.

Our focus includes embedding Indigenous cultural training in our new settlement practitioners' program. We also use Indigenous ceremonies, such as incorporating down feathers and smudging, in the opening of SVNH sites for in-person programming, upon the lifting of the restrictions on in-person gatherings imposed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

One of our memorable events was the All Nations gathering at Killarney Community Centre, which had over 100 people from the community that attended.

Thank you to our Indigenous Council, which meets monthly, and is committed to supporting SVNH in moving talks of decolonization into walks of action.

### Message from our Board Chair & Executive Virestor

The past year has been a challenging yet rewarding time here at SVNH. As the world emerged from the global pandemic, the SVNH community collectively did the same: remaining resilient, adaptable, and dedicated to serving our community.

SVNH continued to prioritize food security initiatives, including distributing food hampers to vulnerable individuals and families in our neighborhood.

Our youth programs thrived, providing a safe and supportive space for young people to develop their skills, express themselves, and engage in meaningful activities. We organized workshops, mentoring programs, and recreational activities; promoting personal growth and community involvement.

Recognizing the unique challenges faced by seniors during the pandemic, SVNH intensified our efforts to support their physical and emotional well-being. We expanded our online programming, organized virtual social gatherings, and facilitated access to essential services such as healthcare and government benefits.

Our efforts to reshape the narrative have fostered a deeper sense of belonging and connectedness among residents. This is an enormous achievement, given that South Vancouver is 20 to 32% more racialized than the rest of Vancouver and has 10 to 18% more immigrants. We are immensely proud of the SVNH team for their unwavering dedication, creativity, and adaptability. Their tireless efforts have allowed us to continue delivering impactful programs and services to our community.

We extend our deepest gratitude to our volunteers and community partners. Their generosity, time, and collaborative spirit have made a profound difference in the lives of many, fostering a stronger and more resilient community. As we move forward, let us build upon the findings from the Reframing South Vancouver Initiative; the inspiring stories of individuals, and the unwavering spirit of our community. Together, we can continue to address emerging challenges, uplift our community members, and create a South Vancouver that thrives.

Thank you for your steadfast support and for being an integral part of the South Vancouver Neighbourhood House journey.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT FISCAL YEAR - 2022/2023

South Vancouver Neighbourhood House (SVNH) had an operating surplus of \$240,442 at March 31, 2023. The board has committed to restricting a portion of the surplus funds to save for operational contingencies, and to help pay for capital repairs, and replacements to maintain SVNH's facilities and infrastructure.

In a year-to-year comparison, the overall revenue increased by 8%, and expenses increased by 11%. Strong support came from the provincial government. The federal government was also very active in many program areas. Further support poured in from the municipal government, as well as individual and corporate donors.


SVNH spent \$27,000 to upgrade/replace workstations at various sites to accommodate the growing staff team, and to support a hybrid work environment. We started our rooftop playground repair in June 2023, and the rooftop repair will provide a safer and more comfortable play area for our childcare program. The City of Vancouver contributed \$27,500 to this project. The remainder of the project costs will be paid using capital reserve funds and Walk-a-Thon fundraising.

The Reframing South Vancouver team has brought a lot of attention to the South Vancouver area, and we are now going to have a new strategic plan in place to address inequity in the area. A motion is going to be put forward to City Council in 2023 to continue the work of Reframing South Vancouver, to address the inequities in resource distribution in South Vancouver. In addition, we are likely to see increased funding from the provincial and federal governments for new immigrant and settlement services.

The new fiscal year promises to bring excitement as the SVNH team continues to focus on increasing community equity, building connected neighbourhoods, raising SVNH's visibility, and creating stability through diversified funding. Please continue to support us and follow SVNH's development.
